This week all teachers have placed the summer curriculum newsletters and homework information sheet for each class, on the class Google Classroom. Lower phase classes have had this information also sent home as paper copies. Please contact your child's class teacher if you need support to access this information.

School lunch-pupil choice trial.

Since April 1st our school must now adhere to the new workplace recycling laws. The guidance means that we must recycle most of the school waste/rubbish, including school food waste. In a bid to reduce our food waste we have recently trialled a system whereby pupils are asked to confirm their lunch requirements during morning registration. This process started due to our school kitchen reporting that often children informed them that they would prefer different meals than those selected via ParentPay. Therefore, each morning we have been advising the children of the lunch choices available and letting them choose. Obviously, all meal choices correspond with all registered dietary requirements.

We are very pleased to report, that this new system has been working very well and we have seen a huge reduction in daily food waste and have had positive feedback from the pupils.

However, if you do not want your child to be given a choice you may email the school office and we will make sure that your child is provided with the lunch that you have selected for them.

Please continue to place meal bookings on ParentPay as each meal taken must be recorded on the ParentPay booking system.

School lunches-Yes, it's free but you still need to book!

Unfortunately, once again last week, we had an average of 40 children each day, who had not had their lunch booked on our Parent-Pay system by their families. As you can work out, this means that over the week, our kitchen is having to produce 200 additional unexpected meals.

Not pre-booking a lunch meal for your child, means that we are in a difficult position to appreciate the amount of food we need to order on a weekly basis.

We cannot assume your child wants to receive a free school lunch.

Please ensure that you book your child's meal on the days they require a school lunch.

This can be done on a Sunday and then you don't need to worry.

We would really appreciate your support in helping us address this issue.

The School/Parish Car Park- Thank you!

We would like to thank our school community for the fantastic support and co-operation that has been shown, once again this week. The car park has worked well, and many individuals have commented on how much safer they feel when they walk through it. Just a reminder that the permit parking system will be in operation from during drop off and pick up, **8.35 - 9.10 am** and **2.45 - 3.45 pm**.

Using the car park outside these times will be allowed if a valid need occurs i.e. dropping off for breakfast club, picking up an ill child, dropping off a child after a medical/dental appointment etc.

Breakfast club

From 1st April 2024, the cost of attending the childcare session of school breakfast clubs is increasing from £1 to £2 per child. In a bid to support families to access the club, the paid childcare session will run from 8.00 - 8.25 am. The free breakfast only session will run from 8.25 - 8.40 am. **Gates closed at 8.35.** All pupils that are entitled to benefit led free school meals will continue to be able to attend the whole session at no charge and all pupils are entitled to attend the breakfast session at no cost (from 8.25). We are in the process of updating ParentPay to reflect the new charges and any sessions attended following the Easter holiday will be charged at the higher rate.

Year 1 pedestrian safety training.

The year 1 pedestrian crossing training continues next week. MCC will support the school leading the year 1 class to complete this safety training.

The children will work in small groups, supervised by trained MCC staff. High staff ratios, ensure excellent pupil supervision at all times. All Lower Phase pupils in Monmouthshire are offered this training.

OLSM wrap around club.

We are in the process of finalising the information around the wrap around club, but we hope that we will be able to run the club from after half term. More information will follow.

Year 3 swimming.

The year 3 class swimming lessons continues next week. The leisure centre recommend that children bring the following items to their swimming lesson.

- One-piece Swimming costume or Swimming shorts (must be above the knee)
- Towel
- Hair band or swimming hat (long hair must be tied back)
- Goggles (if they choose)

Children must remove all jewellery before they swim, i.e. watches, stud earrings.

School ground day

The next school grounds day will occur on the morning of Saturday 11th May. This time we will focus on tidying up and planting the flower beds and peace garden. If you can only spare a hour your help will be very gratefully received.

The volunteers that helped at the last session saved the school around £500 to tidy up some hedging. This cost would have come out of the school central budget if volunteers hadn't supported the school. Likewise the recent painting of the lower phase and upper phase corridors also saved around £3000. These saving allow the school to use more of the school budget to support pupil learning.

Food in school.

Welsh Government has recently issued advice to schools around the subject of nuts in schools.

At OLSM we do have several children who have been identified as having severe allergic reactions to nuts. We therefore encourage all our families to ensure that lunch boxes or snacks do not contain nuts. Obviously though we and other schools are unable to reduce potential risks to zero. Therefore, schools have been advised that we can no longer refer to our school as 'nut free' as this suggests that ALL risks have been removed.

We still request that all families continue to follow our previous processes to maintain the well-being for all.

OLSM becomes a WOW school!

WOW – the walk to school challenge badges were given out to the children this week. The children who qualified for the badges have actively travelled to school on 3 occasions per week throughout April. Active travel is recorded as walking to school for around 8/10-minute period, park and stride or travelling to school using a bike or scooter.

Please support your child to become more active in the way they come to school. Remember, even if you drive, park a little further away and if your child walks for 8/10 minutes to school they can class their journey as active travel.

Are you having financial difficulties?

Many of us are having to find additional money to pay for our basic needs currently. If you are having difficulties financially, you may want to contact Mr Evans who could help you to identify what support may be available. It is always better to ask for help than to feel alone and helpless.

Additionally, please remember our New2You area in the school reception where many items are available free of charge.

Finally, the school is also a referral agent for the Abergavenny Foodbank, so if you find yourself in an unexpected financial emergency, we are able to ensure families can gain a 3-day emergency food parcel from the foodbank.

School attendance

If you are having difficulties with your child's attendance, please ask the school for support so we can work together to prevent your child's attendance becoming a concern.

Our school attendance target for this year is 95%. Please make every effort to support the school in achieving this. When your child is ill, please ensure you leave a message on the school answerphone informing us of the reason for your child's absence. Please provide as much detail as possible.

Recently the Welsh national Government has redefined what percentage attendance they consider can be classified as a child having persistence absence. The new figure is 90%. If your child's attendance is below this figure, the school may feel it is necessary to make a referral to MCC education welfare service. We appreciate that there may always be genuine reasons for a child to be absent, but it is the parent/carers responsibility to ensure you communicate clearly with the school to allow us to be able to effectively support you. If you feel you need support, please ask for it.

Fruit tuck

As a healthy school we only allow fruit for the morning break. If you have a child in the lower phase (R, Yr1, Y2) the school provides milk and fruit. We ask for a small fee, payable via Parent Pay to cover the fruit cost. Upper phase children (Yr. 3, 4, 5, 6) may bring in 20p daily to purchase their own fruit tuck.

No non-fruit/vegetable items are allowed for mid-morning break please.
